hand weaving hand spinning

dyeing using indigo and Procion dyes on natural fabrics dyeing using disperse dyes in transfer prints on synthetic fabric

transfer prints on synthetic fabric shibori stitching and resists discharge printing and painting using her own stencils and stamps

monoprinting hand and machine stitching

nand and macrine stitching felting fabric construction

fabric construction needle-sculpting photo transfers
